Figure 1. Arrivals to each country by month

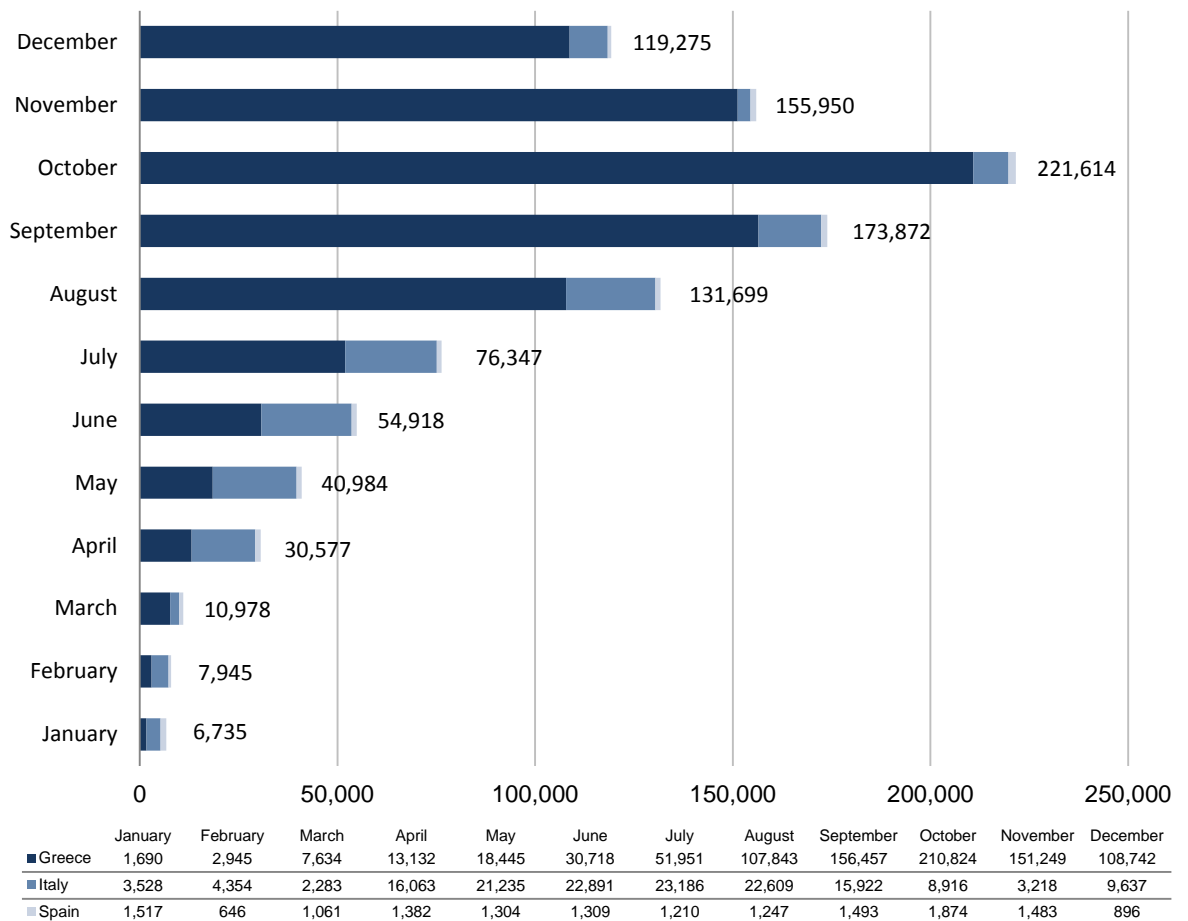


Figure 2. Total arrivals to each country by nationality

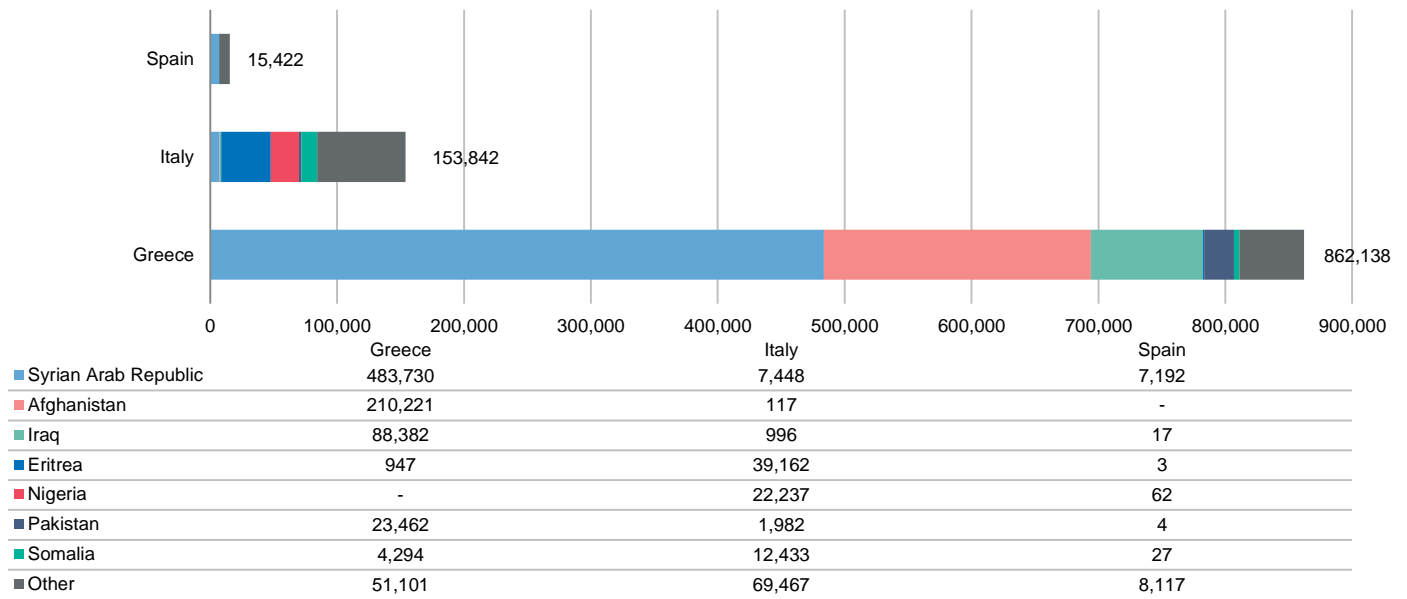
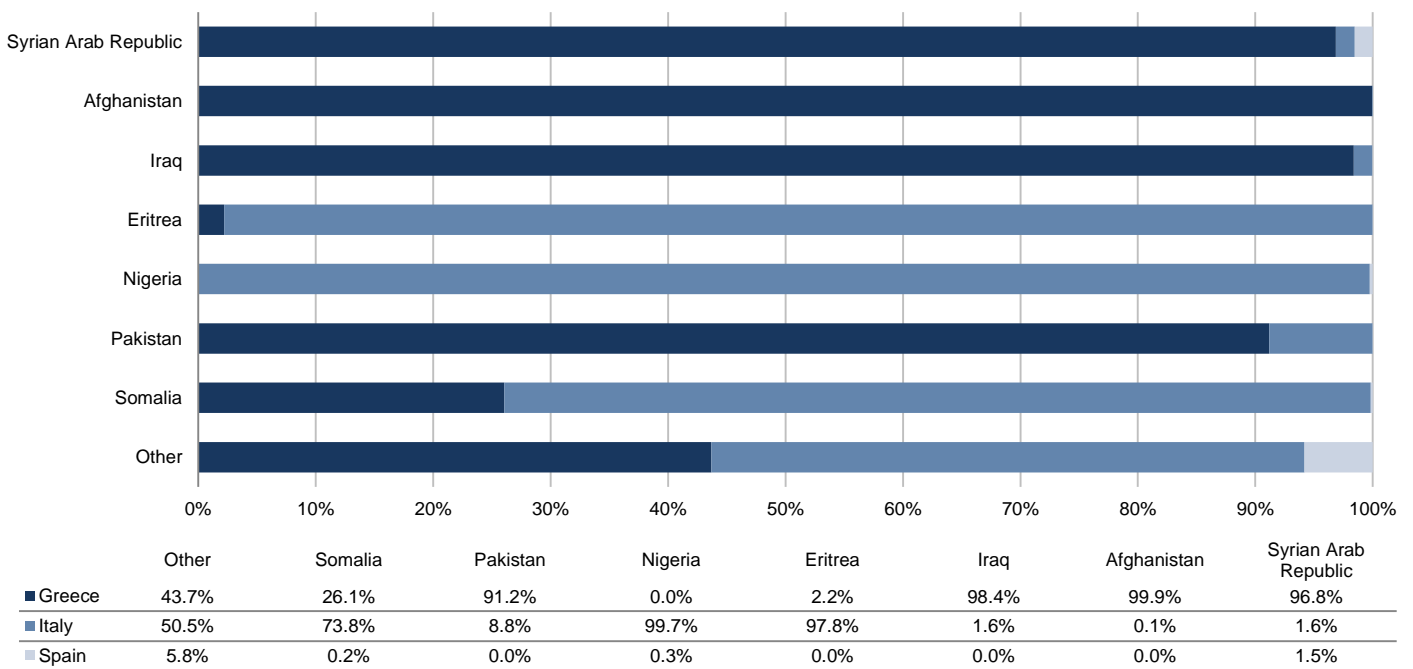


Figure 3. Top nationalities of arrivals in Greece, Italy and Spain

Figure 4. Percentages of nationalities arriving to Greece

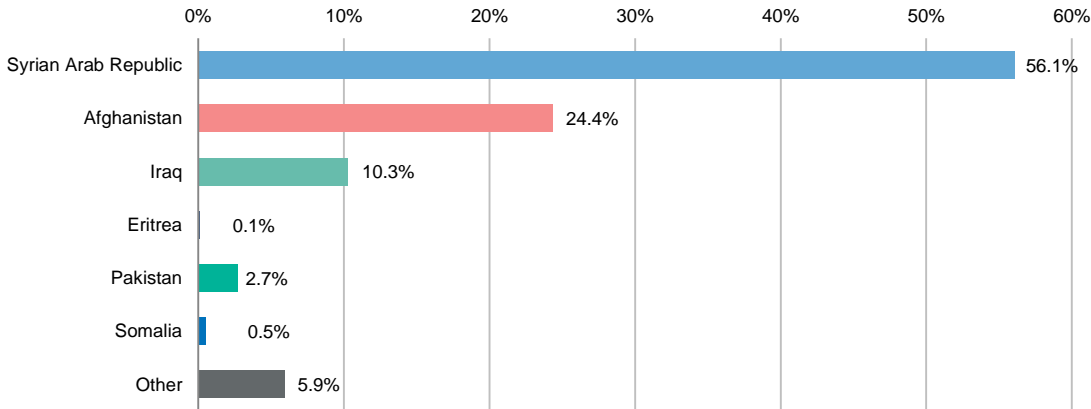


Figure 5. Greece: Monthly sea arrivals by nationality - Trends in 2015

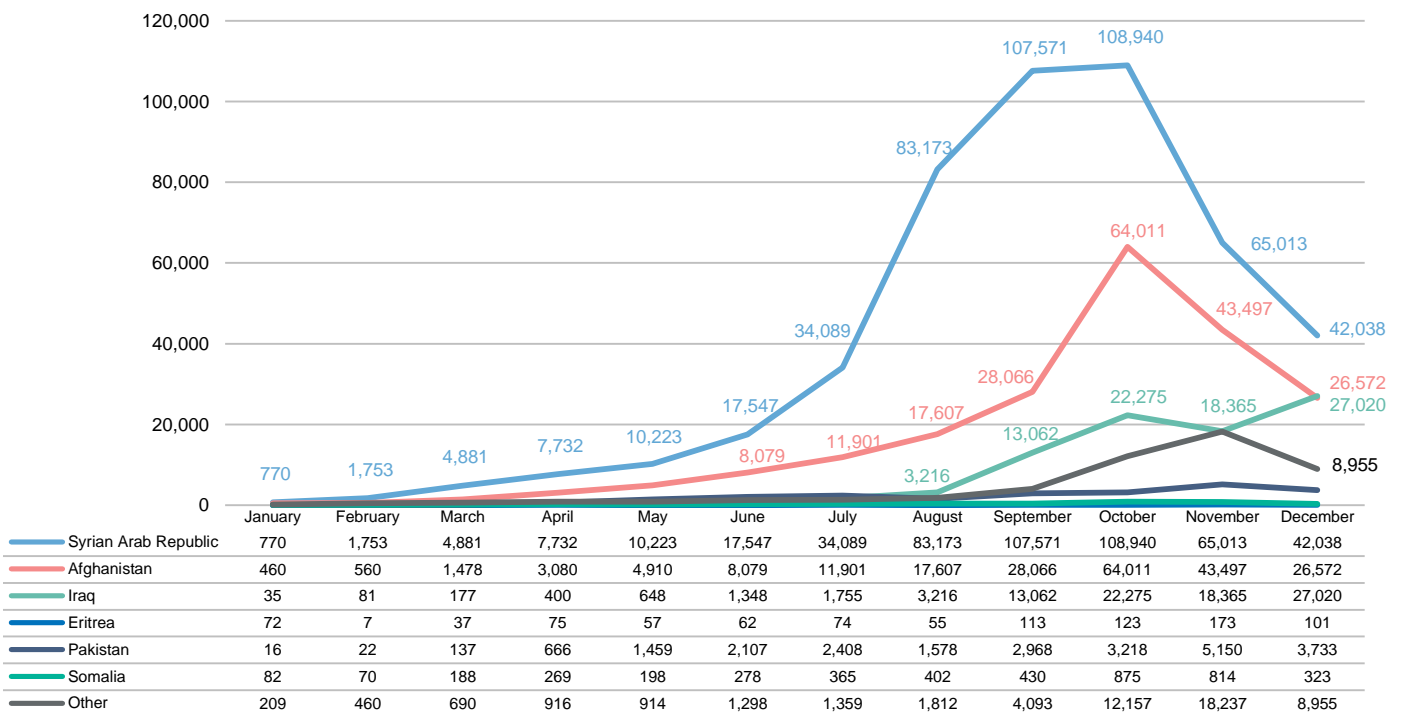
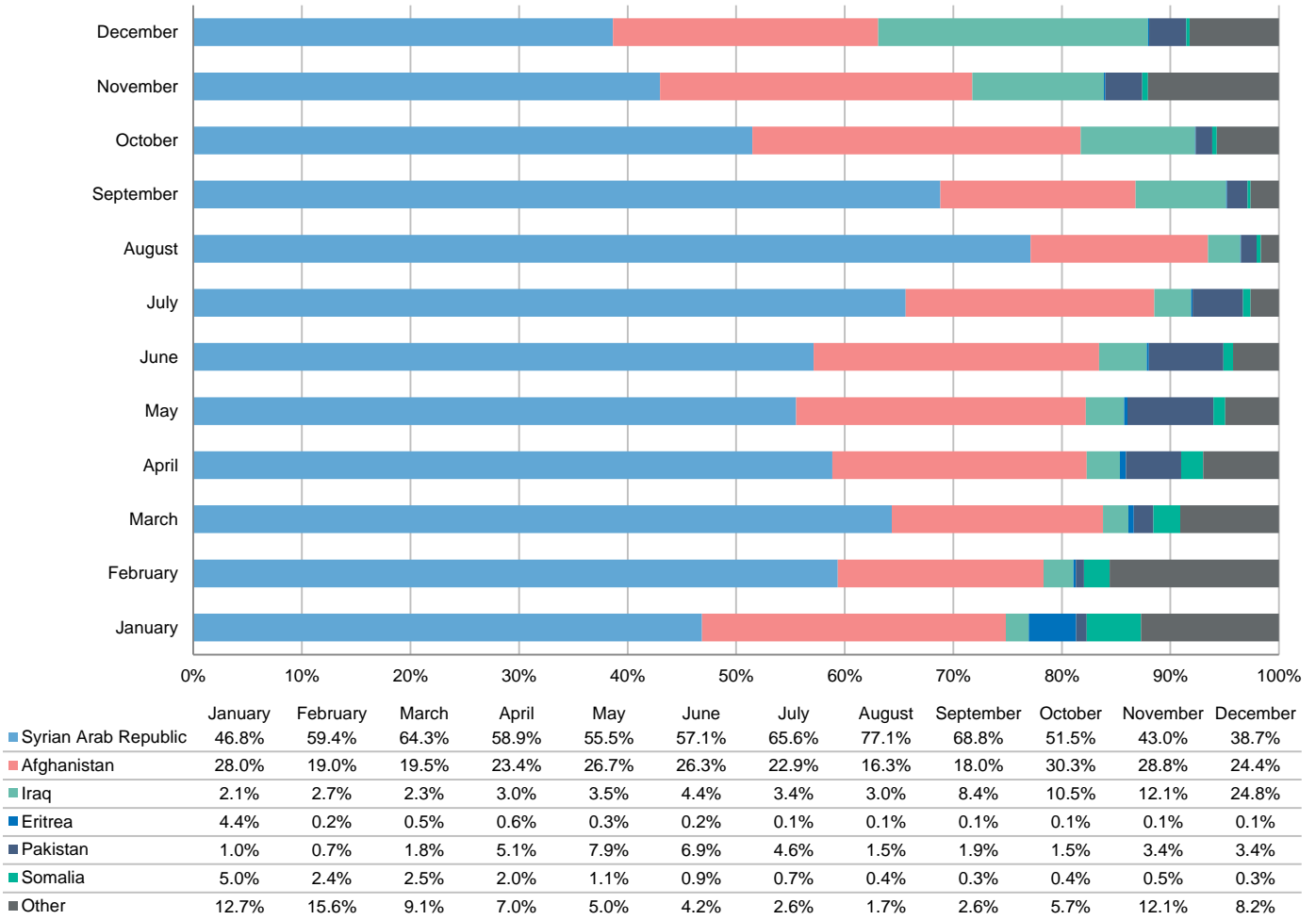


Figure 6. Greece: Percentage of top nationalities of Mediterranean sea arrivals by month

This graph includes the top nationalities of Mediterranean sea arrivals and the top 5 other nationalities of sea arrivals to Italy.

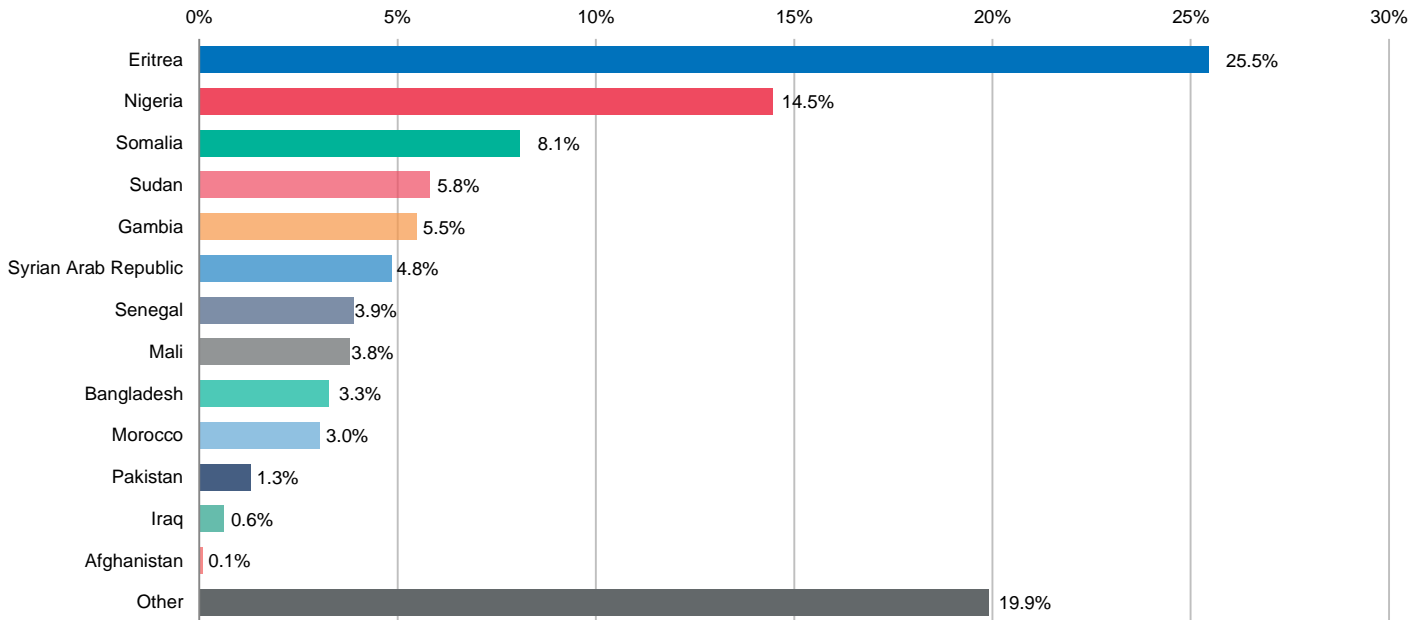


Figure 8. Italy: Top nationalities of Mediterranean sea arrivals - Trends in 2015

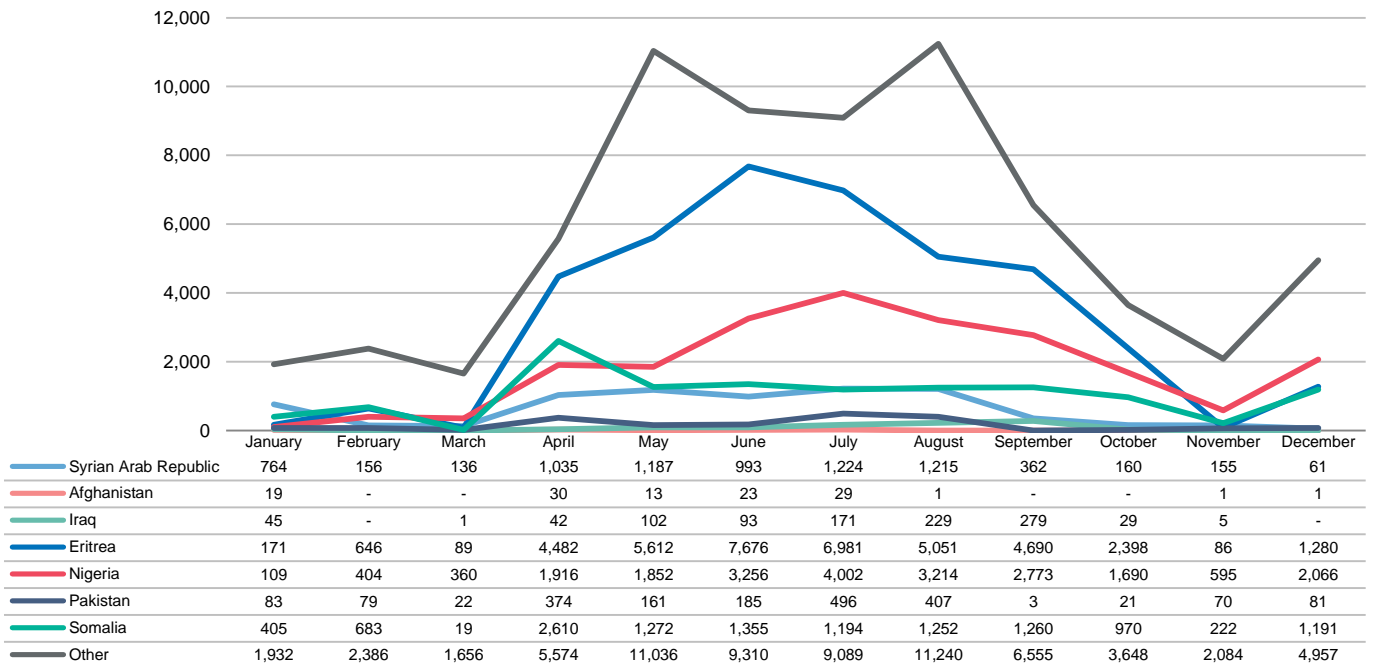


Figure 9. Italy: Percentage of top nationalities of Mediterranean sea arrivals by month

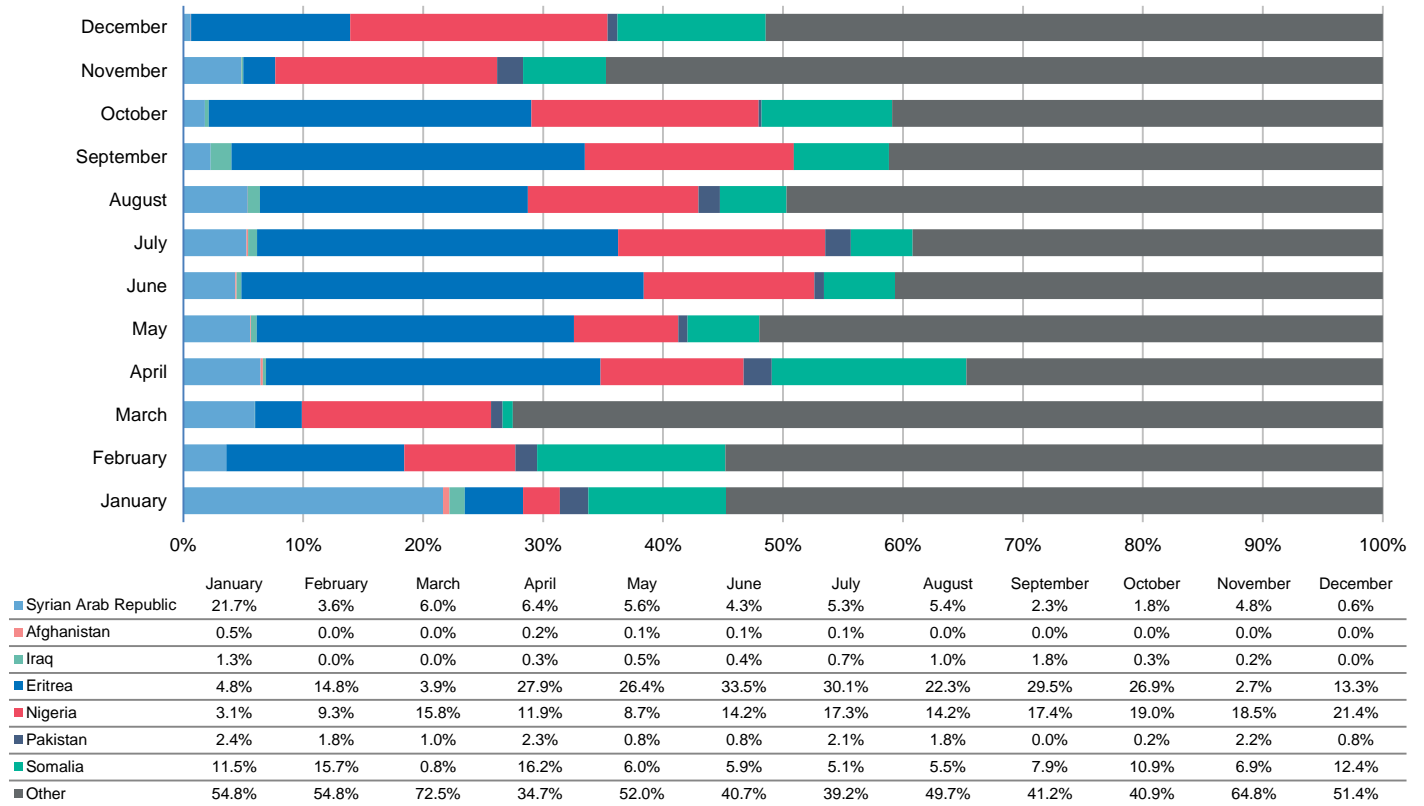
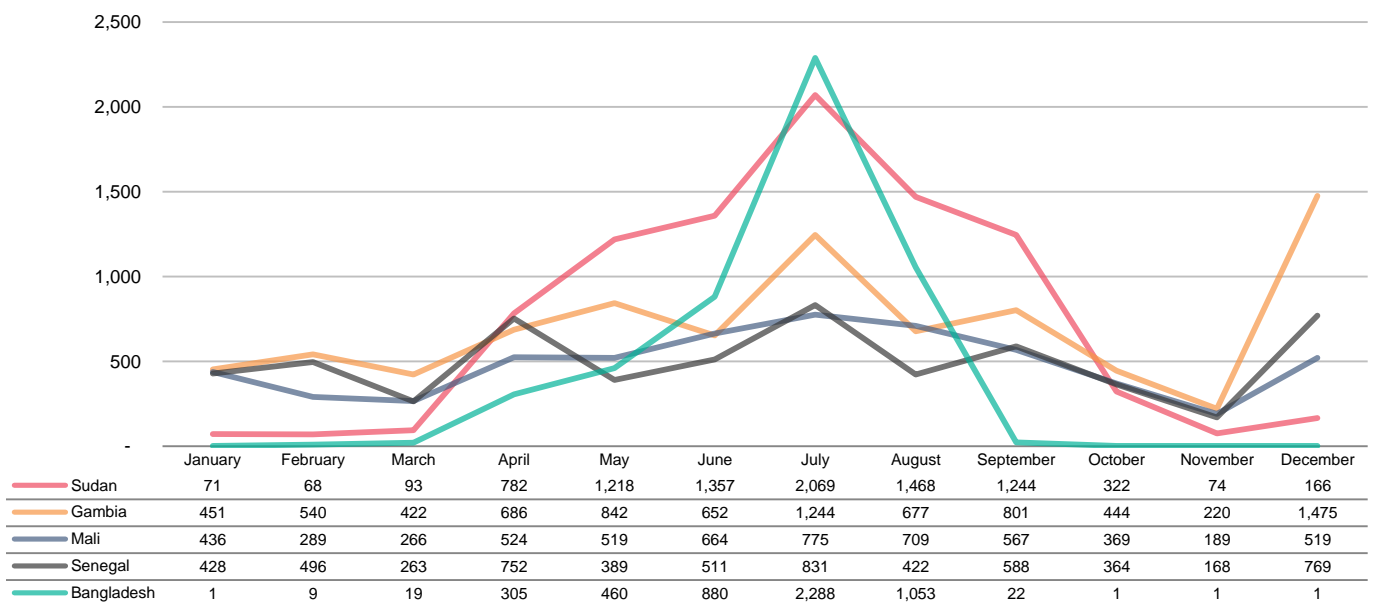


Figure 10. Italy: Monthly sea arrivals of other nationalities - Trends in 2015

Figure 11. Percentages of nationalities arriving to Spain

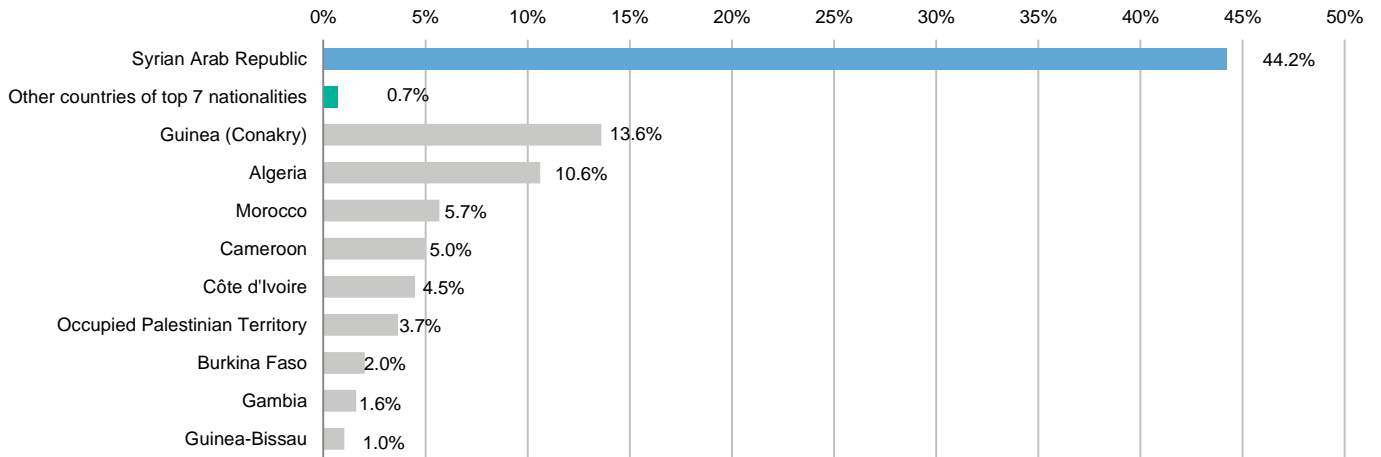


Figure 12. Spain: Top nationalities of Mediterranean sea arrivals - Trends in 2015

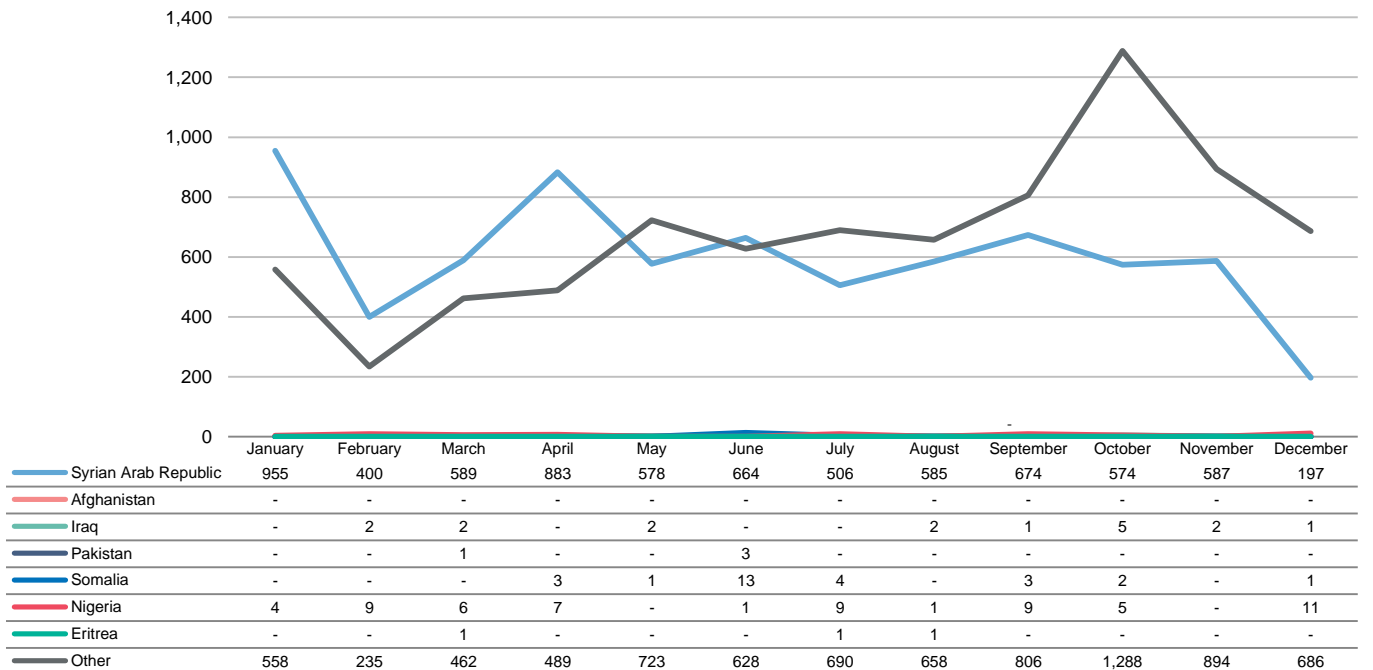


Figure 13. Spain: Percentages of top nationalities of Mediterranean Sea arrivals

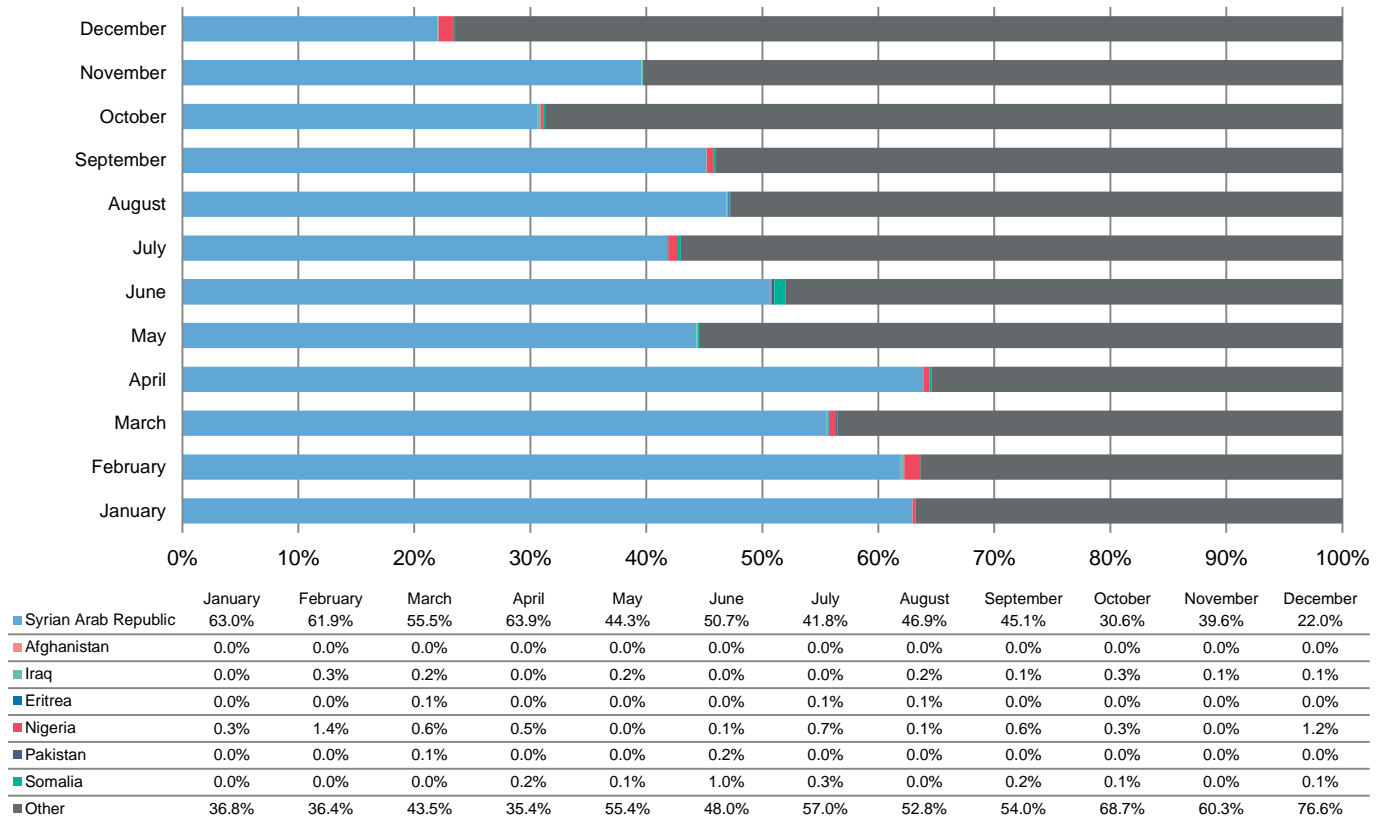
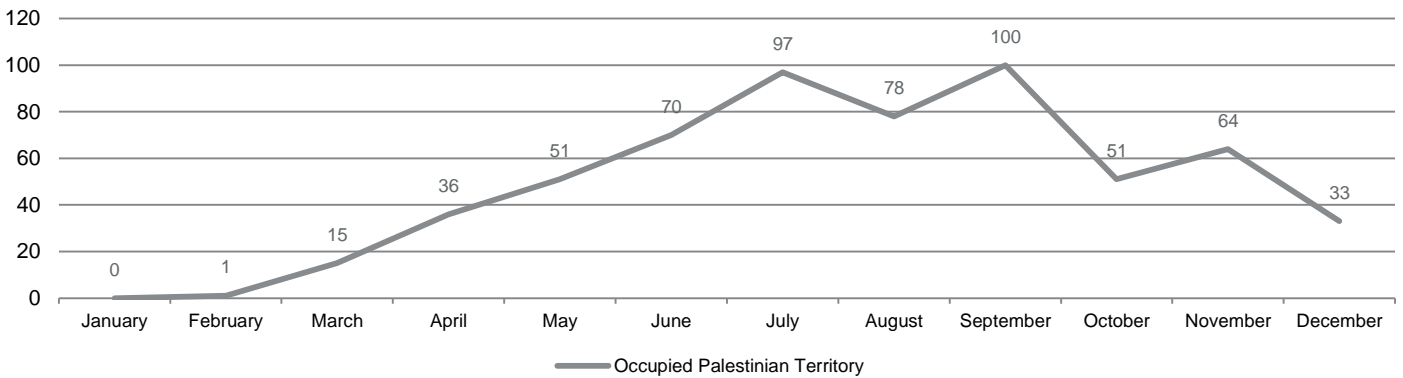


Figure 14. Spain: Arrivals of Palestinian fleeing Syrian conflict
